### What is a Cooperative?

Cooperatives come in many shapes and sizes. They are enterprises formed by groups of people who voluntarily develop, jointly own and democratically control the enterprise to meet their common economic, social or cultural needs.

Cooperatives are based on the values of selfhelp, self-responsibility, democracy, equality, equity and solidarity. Cooperative members believe in the ethical values of honesty, openness, social responsibility and caring for others.

### The cooperative principles are guidelines by which cooperatives put their values into practice.

- 1. Voluntary and Open Membership
- 2. Democratic Member Control
- 3. Member Economic Participation
- 4. Autonomy and Independence
- 5. Education, Training and Information
- 6. Cooperation among Cooperatives
- 7. Concern for Community
