- Freelancers Union Guide Freelancers Union offers a guide for freelancers, self-employed, and independent contractors affected by the Coronavirus.
- <u>Freelancers Union Relief Fund</u> Freelancers Union offers funding for freelancers and independent contractors affected by the Coronavirus.
- Freelancers, self-employed, and independent contractors *may* be eligible for unemployment benefits.
